TODAY'S MUSIC

Kevin Dzierzawski has gone to help his father in Washington D.C. during rehab after surgery. He will return next Sunday.

We welcome Karina Kontorovitch this morning, who will accompany the Chancel Choir on our Offertory Anthem. She is also helping the choir this fall with its preparation for our Christmas cantata.

We welcome back Kris Hansen from his travels in Europe.

O Happy Day! was composed by Edwin Hawkins (1943-2018). He was an artist of wide ranging talents: gospel musician, singer, pianist, composer, arranger, and choir master. He was born in Oakland, CA and was already playing keyboards at age 7 for his family's gospel group. *O Happy Day!* is his most performed and remembered work.

When the Morning Stars Together is a text written by Albert Bayly (1901-1984), a British ship builder who later became a minister in the United Reformed Church. He also provided libretos for cantatas by William Lloyd Webber (1914-1982), the composer father of Andrew Lloyd Webber, the famous music theater composer. The tune, OFFERING, was composed by Jean Slaters Hawk (1925-2004) in 1991. She was a graduate of the Eastman School of Music. In addition to becoming a life-long church musician, she was also a music therapist.

God Is Working His Purpose Out is a favorite hymn of our recently deceased Pastor Emeritus Tom Henry. The text was written by Arthur Campbell Ainger (1841-1919) in 1894. The text demanded a muscular tune, which Martin Shaw (1916-1999) provided in 1915.

Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing, to the tune NETTLETON, is from the rich American tradition of the Sacred Harp hymnals, specifically *Wyeth's Repository Of Sacred Music*. The text was written by Robert Robinson (1735-1790), who began his professional life as an apprentice to a hairdresser before committing himself to a religious life.

Come Ye Sinners Poor and Needy, to the tune RESTORATION, is mined from the wonderful early 19th century American shape-note hymnals including *Southern Harmony*. Its composer and lyricist are unknown, but it was first published in 1835. The melody is characterized by a folk-like swing.

Psalm 150 is set by Louis Lewandowski (1821-1894). Originally, the text was in Hebrew. He was born in Poland. After his mother's death and because of the family's extreme poverty, he moved to Berlin. He was aided by Alexander Mendelssohn, cousin of Felix. He was the first Jew admitted to the Berlin Academy of the Arts. After recovering from serious health problems, he decided to devote his life to composing music for the synagogue. He was in the forefront of the growth of Reform Judaism. In 1882 he wrote the first complete setting of the Jewish Sabbath liturgy for cantor, four part choir, and organ.

When Israel Was in Egypt Land is an African American spiritual of anonymous origin both tune, GO DOWN MOSES, and text. Like many spirituals, this text has at least dual meanings. The text certainly refers to the Jews in the Hebrew Bible Book of Exodus longing for freedom from their slavery in Egypt, but the text also refers to the aspiration African American slaves had for their own freedom from bondage in our own country. Spirituals often used biblical references in order to express their oppression, plans for escape, and longing for freedom, e.g., *Were You There*, *Balm in Gilead*, *Swing Low, Sweet Chariot*, etc.

I Saw the Light was composed and recorded in 1952 by Hank Williams (1923-1953). He was a beloved country music singer and composer. In his all-too-short life, he recorded 35 singles and 11 of those reached No. 1 on the Country & Western charts.

ELECTION WATCH 2022: Judicial Elections. In Cook County, 61 judges are running to be retained in the upcoming election. It is difficult to be well informed about these retentions, but there are some resources. On October 11, the nonpartisan *2022 Cook County Election Guide* was released, providing information from bar associations, surveys filled out by the candidates, and other sources to allow voters to make informed decisions about these races. You can obtain this guide at injusticewatch.org. Judges must receive 60% “yes” votes to retain their seats.

In addition, two justices of the seven-member Illinois Supreme Court will be elected in the upcoming election. Illinois is one of only eight states in which voters directly elect their Supreme Court justices. Millions of dollars have been spent on this year’s contest which will determine which political party will hold the majority on the Court. Of course, once elected, all Illinois Supreme Court justices are sworn to be fair and impartial regardless of party affiliation. Please educate yourself on the various candidates and make prayerful, informed decisions.

REUSE IN YOUR YARD

The key to successfully saving seeds from annual flowers/plants is to let the blooms completely mature and dry, while still on the mother plant. The longer old flower heads wither and dry, the better. To harvest:

- Cut off the flower head
- Spread collected seeds and flower heads in an airy container for a few days to thoroughly dry
- Transfer the seeds into small packages – paper bags work well
- Label bags with the type of plant. Seeds look very similar when dry!
- Store away from direct light
- Seeds saved from annual flowers are best used the following year
